Situation

A nice little boulder near the popular White Wells bathhouse and tearoom on Ilkley Moor.

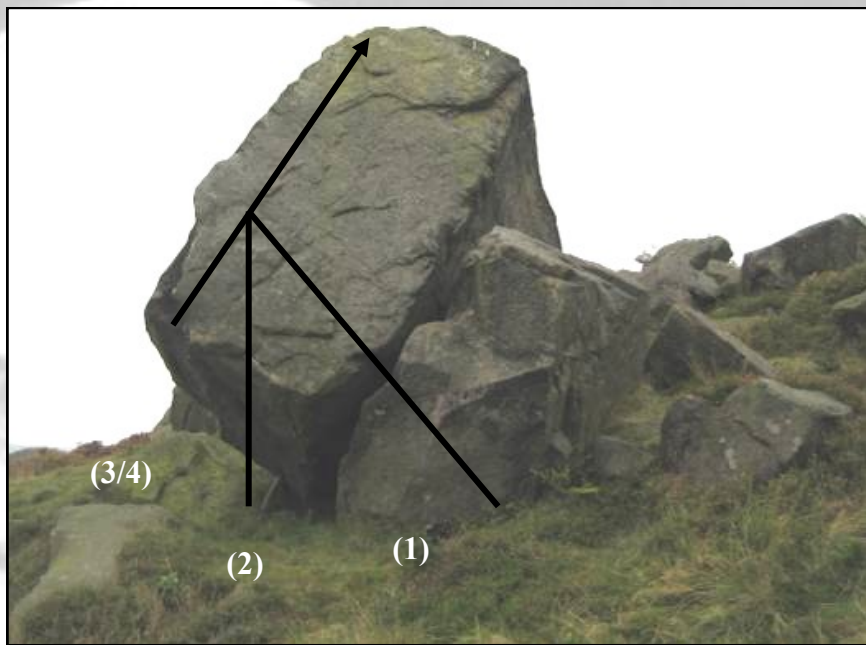
Approach from White Wells or from the tarmac track to Ilkley Tarn, taking the last path onto the moor before the Tarn.

Ideal for family walks; you can even get an all-terrain buggy up there. Also there is some good easier stuff for kids nearby.

The problems are described from right to left. Descend by the polished chips over the back.

The first four finish up the fine arête shown in the picture:

- 1) **Flags 5**
Step off the boulder and delicately cross the slab.
- 2) **Darwin 5**
Pull directly onto the slab, follow the fine arête to the top.
- 3) **Dong 6a**
The arête from sitting. Hang the lip, heel hook and use a variety of other manoeuvres. The lower block is out of bounds.

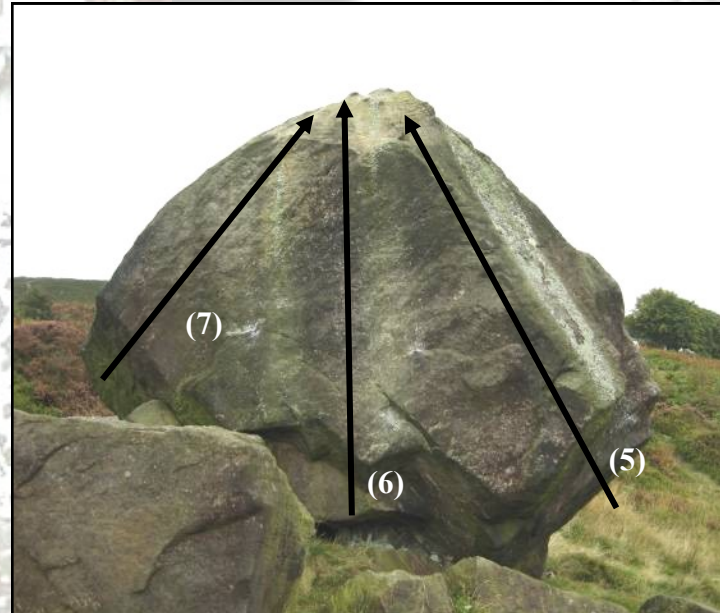


- 4) **Jimi's Groove 5**
Climb the arête's groove from a standing start.

- 5) **Arête 5**
The rear arête to the jugs on the top.

- 6) **Guitar-Gurn 5+**
From a low start slap up the back wall. The right arête is allowed.

- 7) **Left Edge 2**
The easy final arête.
